(TIGER - TRUMPET: DUREN AREA)

A. - T/U 1341 Site A62. Dive bombing mission. Group of three squadrons: A410, 9 planes; A411, 11 planes, C412, 11 planes. 31 F-47 aircraft. "A" Squadron dropped 14 bombs on target "C". Target F-16, 4 not bombed; target F-17, 6 bombed but believed not cut. Unknown number of buildings in Dinsdorf F-1860 destroyed. 2 bombs hung up and were brought back to base armed inasmuch as pilot did not know they were still on aircraft. 1 aircraft joined Turnoil Squadron, reported missing at Liege; radio contact made with him on ground and appears safe. "B" Squadron dropped 16 bombs on target A; tracks cut in three places, F-062813, F-058666, F-031703, and possibly at F-004735. 6 bombs on target C. Tracks cut in 1 place at F-144503 and possibly at F-144503. "C" Squadron dropped all bombs in "C" area as briefed. 6 bombs on railroad tracks at F-08362. Tracks cut in 2 places. 4 bombs dropped on railroad tracks at F-08965. Tracks were cut in 2 places. 3 planes dropped 6 bombs on railroad tracks and locomotive, steam up, headed northeast, 1, plus freight cars, at F-068671. Tracks cut in one place, 3 freight cars destroyed, 2 damaged. Group was over the target area from 1400 hours to 1430 hours. Flak encountered: light, moderate, accurate from Dinsdorf, F-1860. Heavy, moderate, inaccurate in the vicinity of Fritz, F-0667. Light, intense, accurate over F-083652, F-08965, and F-068671. Heavy, moderate, accurate over Juelich, F-035505. Heavy, moderate, inaccurate at Duren, F-130466. Light, moderate, inaccurate from Wieden at F-068634. T/U 1341 Site A62.
